During his tenure at the Milken Institute, Carney was instrumental in raising the Institute's visibility as well as exponentially increasing its programmatic and revenue growth as part of the Institute's drive to become a preeminent financial think tank. Carney is on the board of directors of Microbion Corporation, a life sciences company that develops innovative and scalable antibacterial solutions; Children's Creative Learning Center, the nation's leader in providing employer-sponsored early childhood education solutions; and various non-profit and community organizations. He is a senior advisor to the Milken Institute.

He also acts as an Independent Non-Executive Director and Audit Committee member of TOM Group Limited, a Hong Kong listed public company.

Mr. Ip is an international banking and real estate professional with 33 years of experience at Citigroup, First National Bank of Chicago, Wells Fargo Bank and Merrill Lynch in Hong Kong, Asia, and United States. He was a Managing Director of Investments at Merrill Lynch (Asia Pacific).

In 1985, Mr. Khan founded the Verus Capital Corporation, a diversified investment group and served as its President and Chief Executive Officer. Verus Capital invested in the venture capital, private equity and real estate fields. Additionally, it has focused on investments in companies in the process of workouts and turnarounds.

From 1985 to 1993, Verus Capital acquired and resold over \$2 billion in real estate properties, becoming the largest syndicator of properties in Canada. With a geographic focus on western Canada including Vancouver, Calgary, Edmonton and Whistler, Verus Capital acquired portfolios of distressed land, as well as, commercial and residential properties from the Canadian banks refinancing them through limited partnerships and tax vehicles. Outside of these portfolios, Mr. Khan also acquired existing residential and commercial properties around western Canada as a principal investor and rolled them together as general and limited partnerships.

In 1999, Mr. Khan founded the Verus International Group, a private investment firm and family office focused on investments in middle market platforms and growth oriented companies around the world. Mr. Khan is the Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of the Verus International Group. Verus, as lead investor and principal has directly invested and financed over \$2 billion in private equity transactions. Mr. Khan plays an active management role with portfolio companies, utilizing his extensive global network of relationships to drive significant value. Mr. Khan has served on the board of directors of several private and publicly quoted companies.

His late father a British diplomat, Mr. Khan was born in Nigeria and educated in the United Kingdom. He is fluent in both Urdu and Hindi. Mr. Khan is a resident of Barbados and a citizen of Canada and the United Kingdom.

Denis O'Brien

Denis O'Brien is Chairman and principal shareholder of the privately-owned Digicel Group, one of the fastest growing cellular companies in the world.

Mr. O'Brien founded Digicel in 2001 when the company launched a GSM cellular phone service in the Caribbean. The Digicel Group has extended its operations to 32 markets with over 11.9 million subscribers in the Caribbean, Central America and South Pacific regions, including Jamaica, Haiti and Papua New Guinea

Mr. O'Brien is one of Ireland's leading entrepreneurs with extensive investments across several sectors including international telecoms, radio, media, property, aircraft leasing, golf, online recruitment and other interests. He also founded Communicorp Group, which owns and manages a portfolio of media and broadcasting-related companies in Ireland, Bulgaria and Latvia.

Denis O'Brien founded the Esat Telecom Group plc and built it throughout the 1990's until its sale to British Telecom plc for € 2.4 billion.

Outside of his extensive business interests, Denis chaired the 2003 Special Olympics World Summer Games in Ireland. It was the first time the Summer Games were staged outside the US with teams from 160 countries and over 30,000 volunteers, the 2003 Summer Games were the most successful ever.

Denis is a Director on the US Board of Concern Worldwide and a member of the Broadband Commission for Digital Development. In addition, he is the Chairman and Co-Founder of Frontline, the International Foundation for the Protection of Human Rights Defenders. Based in Dublin, Frontline is working to ensure that the standards set out in the UN Declaration on Human Rights Defenders, adopted in 1998, are known, respected and adhered to worldwide. Frontline's work consists of research, advocacy, communications/technical assistance and emergency evacuation of human rights activists.

In 2000 he established The Iris O'Brien Foundation to identify and assist projects in Ireland and internationally which aim to alleviate disadvantaged communities.

Denis holds a BA degree from University College Dublin and an MBA from Boston College.
